

Uniform Policy

Hunter Sports High School students wear their uniform with pride. All students are expected to wear full school uniform each day.

Parents are requested to ensure that students wear the Hunter Sports High School uniform and to support the school's safety policy with regard to footwear. Department of Education and Work, Health and Safety legislation require specified footwear.

Monday and Wednesday - Students are to wear their whole school sports uniform

Tuesday, Thursday and Friday - Students are to wear their all seasons uniform consisting of white shirt and black shorts/pants or green skirt. All black shoes (leather preferable) and optional tie.

PDHPE/PASS on a Tuesday, Thursday or Friday - Any students who have PASS or PDHPE must wear their all seasons uniform throughout the day and get changed into their sports uniform before and after the lesson.

GIRLS ALL SEASONS UNIFORM:

HSHS school skirt or shorts (no shorter than mid-thigh), or black trousers/trackpants with a junior or senior white school shirt. White socks and black shoes. School black v-neck/hooded jumper or jacket.

BOYS ALL SEASONS UNIFORM:

HSHS black shorts or black trousers/trackpants and white school shirt. White socks and black shoes. School black v-neck/hooded jumper or jacket. Tie is optional.











SPORTS UNIFORM: UNISEX

SPORTS ACADEMY UNIFORM: UNISEX

It is compulsory for all Sports Academy students to wear full school uniform at all times. This includes correct Sports Academy uniform at appropriate times. Sports Academy students must wear either dress shorts, pants or skirt and white shirt when representing the school. Additional or replacement Sports Academy training uniforms are available at Lowes.









WINTER UNIFORM:

Girls may wear black stockings under school skirts and only HSHS school leggings are allowed. Both girls and boys can wear the unisex school tracksuit, black v-neck jumper or hooded jumper.













SHOES:

The school expects that students wear safe black leather lace-up style shoes (including black sole) or a style which covers the top of the foot. Suede skate shoes are acceptable as long as they have a substantial leather tongue. NOTE: Covered leather shoes must be worn to all lessons involving practical work (Science, Food Technology, Industrial Arts).

NOT ACCEPTABLE:

- ·Shoes with mesh or fabric tongue
- ·Black or coloured flat 'ballet' styles
- ·Black fabric or canvas slip on shoes



THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE:

- ·Coloured t-shirts worn under the school shirt. If a shirt is worn under the school shirt, it must be white.
- ·Multi-coloured sloppy joes, hoodies or polos
- ·Representative track pants or tops
- ·Tights under school shorts or skirts (black stockings only)
- ·Extremely short shorts
- ·Coloured caps or hats (no hats are to be worn indoors)

Note: Jewellery must be kept to a minimum. Large coloured or metal earrings are not part of the uniform.

The wearing of this uniform is supported by the school community. The uniform policy is in line with Department of Education, Work, Health and Safety guidelines. For further clarification of the uniform requirements, please contact the relevant Year Advisor or Deputy Principal.

The community has accepted the wearing of school uniforms as part of the School Welfare and Discipline Policy. It is desirable that all pupils wear school uniform for a number of important reasons, including student safety through rapid identification of non-pupils on school grounds. The co-operation of all staff members is required to encourage pupils to take pride in their appearance. Having all students in uniform provides equity in that all students wear the same, which costs the same. Wearing school uniform promotes pride and dignity in oneself and earns community respect for the individual student and the school as a whole.

Any student who is genuinely unable to comply with the school uniform requirements due to financial reasons should contact the school. Arrangements will be made at the school to assist the student to comply with the dress code.
